What is Exeter Scholars?

Exeter Scholars is a free programme giving participants the opportunity to develop their knowledge about university and experience what it is like to study a subject of their choice at university level. They will gain access to world leading academics and current students at the University of Exeter who will support them with making decisions about their educational progression and help them develop skills to support both their future and their current studies.

Who can take part?

Becoming an Exeter Scholar can be achieved by completing one of two unique pathways that include a range of specific events and activities as well as the supplementary Exeter Scholars activities available to all participants. The eligibility criteria for the two pathways are as follows:

Year 10-13 Pathway

Students that meet one of the following criteria and are also of black, Asian and minority ethnic origin are eligible to apply to take part in the University of Exeter Scholars programme:

- You live in a neighbourhood where a low percentage of young people progress to higher education as defined by your home postcode
- 2. Live in a low income neighbourhood as defined by home postcode
- 3. Are in receipt of free school meals
- 4. Are eligible for school bursaries
- 5. Parents have not studied at university
- 6. Are or have been living in care
- 7. Have caring responsibilities
- 8. Have a disability

Year 12-13 Pathway

Students that meet one of the following criteria are eligible to apply to take part in the University of Exeter Scholars programme:

- You live in a neighbourhood where a low percentage of young people progress to higher education as defined by your home postcode
- 2. Live in a low income neighbourhood as defined by home postcode
- 3. Are in receipt of free school meals
- 4. Are eligible for school bursaries
- 5. Parents have not studied at university
- 6. Are or have been living in care
- 7. Have caring responsibilities
- 8. Have a disability

To commence any pathway applicants must have the ability to achieve a minimum of 8 GCSE's at grades A*-C or 9-4 to include GCSE Maths and English at Grade 4 or Grade C and above. Where a pathway consists of a combination of pre-16 and post-16 activities the transition between the two are dependent on attainment of the aforementioned GCSE grades which will be confirmed at the beginning of Year 12.





What do participants do?

Exclusive Exeter Scholars Supplementary Activities:

- □ Regular live online Q&A forums throughout Year 11, 12 and 13
- ☐ Exclusive access to a Year 11 online platform which participants can use to find out about university through a range of interactive activities and resources
- Exclusive access to a Year 13 online platform designed to help participants complete their UCAS application and prepare for the transition to university



In addition to the supplementary Exeter Scholars activities participants will complete one of the following pathways in order to graduate as a University of Exeter Scholar:

- Exclusive access to a range of Exeter Scholars Awards, including the Exeter Scholars Attainment Award*
- A 'Transition to Student Life' financial support package, consisting of:

 - £100 towards Students Guild / FXU or £100 towards gym membership or £100 towards Athletic Union membership (All to be used in first year only)
