

UNIVERSITY OF EXETER SCHOLARS: SOUTH WEST PATHWAYS



What is Exeter Scholars?

Exeter Scholars is a free programme giving participants the opportunity to develop their knowledge about university and experience what it is like to study a subject of their choice at university level. They will gain access to world leading academics and current students at the University of Exeter who will support them with making decisions about their educational progression and help them develop skills to support both their future and their current studies.

I learned how to talk to new people, I learned about topics I find fascinating, more importantly I learned about myself and what I want to get out of university.

Who can take part?

Becoming an Exeter Scholar can be achieved by completing one of three unique pathways that include a range of specific events and activities as well as the Exeter Scholars supplementary activities available to all participants. The eligibility criteria for the three pathways are as follows:

Students that meet one of the following criteria are eligible to apply to take part in the University of Exeter Scholars programme:

- 1. Live in a neighbourhood where a low percentage of young people progress to higher education as defined by home postcode
- 2. Live in a low income neighbourhood as defined by home postcode
- 3. Are in receipt of free school meals
- 4. Are eligible for school bursaries
- 5. Parents have not studied at university
- 6. Are or have been living in care
- 7. Have caring responsibilities
- 8. Have a disability

To commence any pathway applicants must have the ability to achieve a minimum of 8 GCSE's at grades A*—C or 9—4 to include GCSE Maths and English at Grade 4 and above. Where a pathway consists of a combination of pre-16 and post-16 activities the transition between the two are dependent on attainment of the aforementioned GCSE grades which will be confirmed at the beginning of Year 12.

The commitment of all participants that complete a pre 16 activity pathway will be recognised at the end of Year 11 through the awarding of the title of Exeter Junior Scholar regardless of whether they achieve the necessary GCSE grades to progress with the programme.







What do participants do?

Exclusive Exeter Scholars Supplementary Activities:

- □ Regular live online Q&A forums throughout Year 11, 12 and 13
- Exclusive access to a Year 11 online platform which participants can use to find out about university through a range of interactive activities and resources
- Exclusive access to a Year 13 online platform designed to help participants complete their UCAS application and prepare for the transition to university



In combination with the Exeter Scholars supplementary activities participants will enroll on one of the following pathways in order to graduate as a University of Exeter Scholar:

- All offers or invitations to interview will be dependent on the applicants ability to fulfill any subject specific and GCSE entry requirements, admissions tests and interviews for their chosen course.

If participants choose to apply to study at the University of Exeter they will be invited to complete the Exeter Scholars online assessment in Year 13 to qualify as a **Senior Scholar**. Successfully passing the assessment will gain access to the following additional benefits:

University of Exeter Senior Scholars Benefits

- An invitation to a private pre-Freshers' Week welcome and orientation reception at the University of Exeter
- Exclusive access to a range of Exeter Scholars Awards, including the Exeter Scholars Attainment Award*
- A 'Transition to Student Life' financial support package, consisting of:
 - ☐ A three-year 16—25 Railcard or £70 Supermarket voucher or £70 Amazon voucher
 - £100 towards Students Guild / FXU or £100 towards gym membership or £100 towards Athletic Union membership (All to be used in first year only)
